

Understanding the World

The children will start the year thinking about themselves and their families in our 'Amazing Me' topic. We will think about some of the things that make us unique and talk about some of the similarities and differences between us and our friends and family. We will think about people who help us and the important role of nurses in our 'Nurturing Nurses' topic. The children will also look at how the seasons change by observing the plants, trees, animals and weather.

Expressive Arts and Design

This term, the children will be learning to sing songs, join in with role-play activities and dance to music. They will explore the sounds that different instruments make and get to experiment with them in their 'Busy Learning time.' There will be plenty of opportunities to experiment with using a variety of different construction materials and learn different ways to join them together. They will also construct and manipulate objects.

RE

Being special. Where do I belong?

The children will share occasions when things have happened in their lives that made them feel special. They will retell religious stories making connections with personal experiences. They will recall simply what happens at a traditional Christian infant baptism and what happens when a baby is welcomed into other religions.

Amazing Me & Nurturing Nurses

Literacy

Reading - The children will have the opportunity to explore a wide range of fiction and non-fiction books that will help inspire a love of reading.

Phonics - The children will learn to say and recognise letter sounds using the Read Write Inc mnemonics to help them. They will learn to segment and blend simple CV, CVC words e.g it, cat. They will then begin to read words and simple sentences. Through **Talk for Writing**, the children will learn to retell some traditional stories, poems and instruction texts. They will develop the ability to innovate these texts.

Writing - This term, the children will learn to recognise/copy/write their own name. They will learn to form clearly identifiable letters and attempt to write CVC words, labels and captions.

Mathematics

Number and number patterns.

This term, the children will explore the composition of the numbers to 5. They will count objects, actions and sounds. They will develop the ability to subitise and link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value. The children will learn to develop an understanding in the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers. They will learn to recognise 2D shapes, patterns and use everyday language related to weight and size.

Physical Development

This term, we will be developing children's fine motor skills through 'Funky fingers', scissor work, colouring, painting and drawing. They will work on their gross motor skills in our P.E sessions and during their 'Independent Learning time'. They will run, jump, climb, complete obstacle courses and play games with their friends.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Though our Jigsaw lessons and stories such as the Colour Monster, we are going to explore and name a variety of feelings we experience. The children will learn to follow instructions involving several ideas or actions. They will begin to manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs, including dressing and going to the toilet. The children will also develop positive attachments to adults and friendships with peers through working collaboratively both inside and outside.

Communication and Language

The children will listen to a range of stories and respond to what they hear. They will demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them by retelling stories and narratives using their own words and recently introduced vocabulary. They will participate in small group, class and one-to-one discussions, offering their own ideas.

Dear Parents and Carers, welcome to school! It's lovely to see how well your children have settled in. This term, we are starting off with an 'Amazing Me' topic. We will talk about our similarities, differences and what makes us special. We will also be finding out about 'Nurturing Nurses' as part of our EYFS/KS1 topic. In Reception, our learning will take place both inside and outside. For this, they will need to bring in a pair of named wellies, so they can access all the outdoor provision. Please remember you can help us at home by talking to your child about what they have been up to during the day; I'm sure they would be very enthusiastic to discuss the activities they have taken part in. I will also be sending home some 'WOW slips', so you can share with us any WOW moments that happen at home, that we can celebrate in school. The children's PE kits, including a lightweight waterproof, need to be in school every day please, with water bottles and book bags!
