Spring Term Newsletter No.02

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the second newsletter of the spring term. I am pleased to report that swimming for KS2 children at Webber's started last Friday and continues today. The children were all assessed by the swimming instructors last week and have now been placed into different ability groups, so the sessions start properly today. I am also pleased to report that teacher-led and after-school clubs have both commenced too with good take up across the board. Of particular note is Mrs. Gillard's Colouring Club, which has proved so popular, she has kindly arranged 2 extra groups each week to accommodate everyone. Thank you to Mrs. Gillard and all the teaching staff, who choose to run clubs in their own time.

Children in year 5/6 from Webber's recently completed their 3rd and final basketball tournament at Uffculme school. Every time I take children to these events, I am so proud to see the teams work together and support each other (apart from when they play each other of course!). Webber's Wizards placed 6th overall and Webbers Mystics placed 8th – I would like to thank all children who **volunteered** their time and effort to represent their school.

Continuing with the sporting theme, selected children in year 5/6 from both schools recently attended the Sports Hall athletics event at Uffculme school. Children competed in a range of indoor events including sprinting, jumping and throwing activities with the aim being to amass the *lowest* amount of points overall. Once again, children from both schools gave their all with Burlescombe finishing in 6th place overall and Webber's in 4th. Well done to all involved.

Coming up before half-term, year 1 children from both schools will be going to Uffculme for a Multi-Skills event in the sports hall and the KS2 swimming gala is coming up soon; check out the diary dates to see when.

Both schools are lucky enough to be receiving rail safety and fire safety talks in school soon. Employees from Network Rail and the Fire Service will be coming into school to talk to the children and help raise their awareness of the potential dangers presented by the railway and awareness of fire safety. These sessions are an important extension of the messaging that you, as parents, and we, as schools, deliver to our children about staying safe and giving the children real-life experience of people who work in these sectors is invaluable.

The Local Schools Committee (LSC), which is the system of governance used to have oversight over our schools and the replacement for the old TVP Board of Governors, has been set up and is fully quorate with the first 2 meetings of this academic year having taken place last term and two more to come this term. The LSC play an important role in the drive for school improvement, offering both support and challenge to the headteacher. Committee members visit schools to monitor different aspects of school improvement and report back, helping to ensure that the strategic direction of our schools is progressing as planned and children's experiences are the best they can possibly be. The committee is made up of volunteers, with parent members from each school and one staff member representative too; I would like to thank the members of the LSC for freely giving their time for the service of their community in this important role.

Children in upper key stage two at both schools have recently been bringing their Chromebooks home after school (as I'm sure you've noticed!), which can be used for any educational activity. Their usage is in its embryonic stage at the moment, whilst staff finalise the Virtual Learning Environments and software that will allow us to integrate their usage into the delivery of the wider curriculum giving children the opportunity to create digital portfolios that can be stored and shared with you at home with the use of an associated app. The use of intellectual virtues such as critical thinking, creativity and curiosity will help children develop good habits, as well as supporting the development of modern skills to equip them for life in Key Stage 3.

Burlescombe PTFA held a meeting this week where the successes of events last term were celebrated. The Christmas Crackers, Christmas jumper sale and refreshments served at the Nativity performances at the end of last term raised a staggering total of over £600. The November bingo raised an equally impressive total of over £500. I would like to thank the local business in the Burlescombe and local communities who generously donated prizes for some of these events; and thank you to you too for showing such sterling support for our PTFA, who play a vital role in supporting children's experiences in school – the whole school trip to Paignton Zoo for both schools coming up this term (more information to follow) is

a prime example. Do also look out for "Lilah's Little Library" at Burlescombe Village Hall. This is a book sale where donations are gratefully received in support of Burlescombe PTFA If you are interested in joining either school's essential PTFA team, please enquire at the relevant school office.

Something to add that if your child is sick or has diarrhoea, please can you keep your child at home for at least 48 hours after the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea. We have quite a few cases in school and It is imperative that this rule is followed to prevent it spreading to other children.

Finally, I have some exciting news to share: Alumnis Multi-Academy Trust has a new member of their Social Inclusion Team to work alongside James Creek and Sonia Grant. Her name is Jen Marshall and her primary base will be with the mid-Devon schools — Bampton, Burlescombe and Webbers. Please see a personal profile giving you some information about her after the diary dates section. We are lucky to have the services of Jen, who will be dedicated to helping families of our cluster of 3 schools and I'm sure you join me in wishing her all the best in her new role.


