Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the final newsletter of the spring term. It has been a term packed with learning, fun and activities, so I think we are all looking forward to a welcome 2-week Easter break with our families.

Last week across both schools, parent consultations took place, which were well attended. Thank you for taking the time to speak to your child's class teacher – a joined-up approach from home and school has never been more important in our quest to help children achieve to the best of their ability. If, for any reason, you were unable to attend your consultation, please let the school know and your child's teacher will be happy to call you after school early next term.

This week saw some of our intrepid year 5/6 children return to Uffculme; however, this time they were not practising sports skills, or competing in tournaments...they were putting movements to music and words supported by the excellent PE Sport Leaders at Uffculme. Whilst this event definitely took some out of their comfort zone (me included!), it was very heartening to see children displaying the **creativity** and **courage** required to perform in front of others. The session culminated in an original dance piece performed by each school group in front of everyone else. I am very proud of all those children who chose to take part.

On Monday this week, both schools were visited by the Director of Education, Mrs. Rachael Sharpe and the Chair of the Alumnis Board, Mrs. Gill Marlow. They visited to see how our two schools are progressing with our improvement priorities and to speak with children about their learning...and boy did they speak! As always, when visitors come to our two schools, the children show us every time how truly special they are. Children in our two schools really are *shining stars*, and it is a genuine privilege to lead such talented staff teams and such polite, committed children, who take pleasure in sharing their learning and celebrating their achievements.

Recently, both schools have undergone Safeguarding Reviews conducted by the local authority. These yearly reviews take place to ensure that everything we are doing in school supports the Safeguarding of children, and that the school and its environment is helping to keep children safe. I am pleased to report that both schools' reviews showed that

Safeguarding at both schools is robust and effective.

Continuing with the Safeguarding theme, I am very happy to share with you news that both schools will be receiving upgrades to the systems for entry and exit to school. Next term, Webber's and Burlescombe will both be receiving new, secure entrance gates with an intercom system. This is part of a wider drive to ensure that both schools' sites are as secure as they can be and further upgrades will be taking place in the future.

In the summer term, after school clubs will continue with both teacher-led and Premier Sport-led clubs. I am pleased to confirm that the successful after school club Stage School will continue for KS2 children in the summer term, so be sure to book in early as spaces will be limited and are sure to fill up fast. This club will continue to be open across both schools. I am also pleased to be able to announce at Webber's a new, musical *before* school club — Choir Club — do have a look at the advert in the community section.

Please could I remind children and parents that water bottles in school should contain water and not squash or juice – thank you.

Look out at Burlescombe early next term for a 2nd hand uniform sale – date to be confirmed – with proceeds going to our charity partner Edukid.

Finally, it would be remiss of me not to mention our fantastic day out at Paignton Zoo yesterday. There were a lot of tired, little legs at the end of the day, but boy was the walking worth it! Children saw a variety of different animals from zebras and red pandas to a baby orangutang (who was impossibly cute) and giraffes. Each Key Stage also enjoyed a different themed workshop with KS2 enjoying Conservation Conundrum, KS1 going on an African Safari and EYFS taking on a Curiosity Quest.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank both Burlescombe and Webber's PTFAs for funding the considerable cost for the coaches required to take the children. The fundraising work they do is integral to the enrichment of your child's education and is very much appreciated by children, staff and governors alike. If you are interested in helping the PTFA and joining the team,

please speak to Emma Forward or Sophie Cornish, co-chairs of the Webber's PTFA, or Claire Davis, chair of the Burlescombe PTFA.

The Webber's PTFA are hosting an event this afternoon, and I hear there may even be an Easter Egg hunt – please do attend and support if you are able. Class 1

In class 1, we have been being **inspiring reseachers**, researching Antarctic animals. The children were also **inspiring speakers** presenting their findings to the class. We all learn so much, even Mrs Hunter! Here are just some of the children's wonderful homeworks.

Class 2

Class 2 has been a hive of activity over the last couple of weeks. We have immersed ourselves in Science Week activities and have had opportunities to bring our learning to life. We practised skills linked to classifying, predicting, and hypothesising and then got creative! We ensured fair testing and then were all excited to see how our volcanoes would erupt! Ask your child to let you know how we got on!

In art, we have continued our William Morris focus and have created our own printing blocks. Taking inspiration from nature, in the style of Morris, we worked patiently to design a block printing tile which we will use during the next few days, to produce a wonderful, bright, bold piece of art.

Literacy this term has been an exploration of kenning and haiku poetry. We have worked hard composing our own poems, paying careful attention to the individual features and characteristics of each. RE this term has offered us the opportunity to explore the emotion associated with events from the Easter Story, and we have written reflective Easter prayers, capturing the blend of celebration and loss felt during this Christian festival.

Class 3

Class 3 really enjoyed Science Week 2023. We began the week learning about the history of the solar system and what our ancestors believed, including heliocentric and geocentric models and by researching astronomers. The children then designed and built water rockets in small groups. The designs and ideas were fantastic! On launch day, we quickly attracted an audience as the children from Classes 1 and 2 joined us on the field (from a safe distance!) It was a wonderful atmosphere as we watched the rockets fire off high (or not!)- all competing for first place!

We were incredibly proud of the children in Class 3 for standing in front of the whole school during Collective Worship this week. We have been focusing on the virtue 'citizenship' and the children researched, recorded and presented their understanding about British Values (Democracy, The Rule of Law, Mutual Respect, Individual Liberty and Tolerance of those of different faiths) in small groups. The children gave incredible presentations, spoke confidently and were able to reflect upon how we show our British values as a school. Mr Roffey, Mrs Sharpe (Director of Education) and Mrs Marlow (Co-Chair of the Alumnis board) were also in the audience to see how well the children spoke. Well done for another credit towards becoming Inspiring Researchers and Inspiring Speakers Class 3!

Acorns have had a fantastic last 2 weeks of term. Reception and Year 1 have been learning some animal poems and were courageous enough to perform one in collective worship to the rest of the school. We were very lucky to have a visit from Mrs Marlow who has been to Antarctica! The children were able to ask lots of questions and have been inspired to become explorers themselves. We combined topic and technology and had to programme the Bee Bots to navigate across Antarctica, missing any hazards in their way. Despite the weather, we have spent lots of time outside and the children all worked together to make a lovely Easter garden as part of our RE. Acorns Class thoroughly enjoyed our trip to the zoo yesterday and would all like to say a massive THANK YOU to all involved in organising it for us - it was a great end to the term:)







Squirrels

Children in Squirrels class have been working very hard on completing the year 3 and year 4 unit on fractions in maths. With terminology such as numerators and denominators to learn about, and the equivalence of fractions, it has been challenging at times. However, perseverance and determination have shone through with successful adding, subtracting and comparing of fractions.

In English, children finished the term by writing a short story of their choice. This gave them the chance to exemplify some of the grammatical skills we have been focusing on this term such as the use of paragraphs, fronted adverbials, subordinate clauses and different types of adverbial phrases to create different effects on the reader. I have some lovely holiday reading to complete over the Easter break!
