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#### **Summer Term Newsletter No.03**

#### Academic

It has been another busy 2 weeks at our schools with KS2 completing their SATs exams last week and KS1 completing their assessments this week (with some finishing next week too). Everyone at school could not be prouder of the attitude displayed by children and we look forward to celebrating their results with them in due course.

Coming up soon after half-term is the National Phonics Screening Week for year 1 children and the Multiplication Times Tables Check for year 4 children.

Children in yrs 1 & 2 at Webber's and yrs 1, 2 & 3 at Burlescombe resumed their swimming lessons at Tiverton Swimming Pool this week, where a mixture of building water confidence and instruction on different strokes took place. These sessions continue every Monday for the summer term.

#### **Community**

A Q&A session was held at Burlescombe school this week, to mirror the session held at Webber's recently. Thank you to those parents who were able to attend - I have attached the minutes of the session (thank you to Mr, Barbary for typing them), so you can read through if you were unable to make it on the night.

Each of the activities was points-based, with totals being added and overall winners identified. #### **Innovation**

artist or actor to come into school, the impact on young
minds is immense and one we would like to ensure
every child has the opportunity to experience as they
travel through their primary school years.

# **CHILDREN'S CORNER**

#### Class 1

#### **Academic**

Class One have been learning to retell the fantasy story 'Where The Wild Things Are'. We have created our own 'Wild Thing' characters and are looking forward to writing our own stories next week. Year 1 have started looking at division this week, exploring both grouping and sharing.

#### Community

Class one have been enjoying the sunny weather this week as it has allowed them to play on the school field with the rest of the school at break and lunch times. In R.E, the children have been thinking about Jesus' Good News and how we can show friendliness, forgiveness and peace within our school community.

#### **Character Education**

Children in yrR have children enjoyed ordering numbers to 10 and then 20. They have really enjoyed being 'cheeky' and re-ordering the numbers when their friends closed their eyes. The children have then used their critical thinking skills to re-order the numbers.

#### **Innovation**

Children have really enjoyed interacting with our new interactive white board for their learning and are very excited that we can change the pen colour!

#### Year 2

#### **Academic**

In Year 2, we have particularly enjoyed getting stuck into our maths learning over the past few weeks and have enthusiastically continued to develop our problem solving and reasoning skills. We have been 'explaining our brains' and deepening our understanding through collaborative working. Everyone has enjoyed demonstrating the methods we have been using by 'building' or 'drawing' our ideas by using resources, such as the tens and ones and place value counters.

#### Community

During English, Year 2 have written detailed recounts about the Coronation weekend. It has been wonderful to hear about how the children celebrated the King's Coronation with their families and neighbours and it sounds like much fun was had throughout the community!

#### **Character Education**

We have been developing our critical thinking skills this week by learning how to keep an open mind and showing a growth mindset when faced with problems and challenges; both in our work, as well as within friendships. Playtimes have given us a fantastic opportunity to practise thinking about different points of view and we have learnt to give different solutions to problems we have faced.

#### Innovation

As we have been preparing for our Year 2 SATS we have started to explore how we learn best as individuals. As part of our discussions, we have had great fun inventing many memorable songs, rhymes, silly sentences and chants (with actions) to help us to understand and remember key vocabulary, important facts, spelling rules and grammar terms.

#### Class 2

#### **Academic**

Class 2 have been reading and exploring fiction stories by Satoshi Kitamura. We have been discussing similarities between the featured characters and illustrations of different stories, and writing from the perspective of some of the interesting characters. In maths, Year 3 have been working on volume and capacity, and we have enjoyed the opportunity to roll up our sleeves and get measuring.

#### **Character Education**

We have all been demonstrating the character virtue of critical thinking, and focusing on ways we can use questioning and enquiry to explore different viewpoints and sources of information.

#### **Community**

Class 2 have been sharing lots of achievements from out of school clubs and tournaments recently. We have celebrated and appreciated each other's successes and enjoyed seeing the certificates and medals our friends have been awarded. Well done everyone!

#### Innovation

Class 2 have continued our discussions about how civilizations have evolved and how improved farming techniques, irrigation, and geographical location support new cities to be successful.

### Class 3

#### Academic

It was incredible to see how much the children learnt from their visit to the theatre this week. The performance, which saw an AI robot programmed to restart humanity after an ecological disaster on Planet Earth, discussed advanced concepts; however, the children absorbed the information and came back to school buzzing with wonderful discussion. The letters that they have written - to thank the performers – reflect their understanding of the performance and many have been inspired to work in visual effects!

#### **Character Education**

It has been really evident this week that children are beginning to use language around their Character Education in everyday situations. It was great to 'catch' some children discussing their resilience this week; children are showing virtues increasingly often, which is lovely to see and hear.

#### **Community**

It was wonderful to meet some of the other small schools of Alumnis at Great Torrington this week. Class 3, together with Oaks class, travelled to The Plough Theatre where they watched 'Quintessence': a play written, and performed, by Emily Carding.

#### **Innovation**

After studying Tudor buildings in art, and producing black and white paintings using ink and water, we have been building models in D&T lessons. It's been great to see children's innovative designs transform empty paper boxes into fine Tudor homes!

#### **Acorns**

#### Academic

Year 2 have been fantastic this week while completing their KS1 SATs papers. They all demonstrated such determination, resilience and perseverance throughout all the papers - a massive well done for being such superstars! Year1 and EYFS have also been busy with all things Beatrix Potter. They have reviewed various stories, and even got into the role of various characters writing postcards. I have seen some lovely drawings the children created based on their favourite Beatrix Potter story.

#### Community

Acorns class have been busy preparing questions ready to ask Rev Glynn next week when we all see him. The children are looking forward to finding more about what Rev Glynn does and ask him his thoughts on our RE learning this half term. EYFS have continued to be very helpful looking after our garden. Children have been seen watering the plants, sweeping leaves and helping Ms. Brainch sort out the outside equipment.

#### **Character Education**

Acorns class have continued to show resilience this week in their learning and assessments. It can be very tricky but the children drew on our discussions and stories and have shown great resilience in their characters this week. Year 1 has demonstrated our new virtue of focus, critical thinking, particularly in their maths, while working out different ways to show fractions of shapes and numbers. It was challenging to find different ways of shading shapes, but the children did not give up.

#### Innovation

KS1 in Acorns have been busy innovating different ways to decorate and construct mobiles in RE. These were designed to show our individual thoughts on friendliness, forgiveness and peace based on our current learning. EYFS have continued to innovate during busy learning; a marvellous rainbow house was created using the large outside blocks. We are thoroughly enjoying this lovely weather and making the most of it by being outside as much as we can!

#### **Squirrels**

#### Academic

Children in year 4 have been using different types of graph to represent different forms of data in science recently and thinking about the type of graph we need to present different sorts of data. When do we use a bar chart? Why would a line graph be better? Those sorts of questions have been positively *smashed* this week! Year 3 children completed their work on volume and capacity and have started to enter the wonderful world of fractions!

#### Community

Children in Squirrels class took part in the year 3/4 Tri-Golf Festival at Uffculme School last week. This was a great opportunity to practise skills associated with golf in the spirit of friendly competition. Unfortunately, due to the inclement weather, the event was held in the school hall, but a raft of skills were practised and competed with. A fantastic attitude was displayed by all involved - well done.

#### **Character Education**

Squirrels have been displaying our focus virtue of critical thinking in almost everything they do. Whether that is questioning the information they research, or are presented with by the teacher, or thinking critically about the best way to approach a tricky maths problem, we have learnt that critical thinking is central to our ability to learn new information and understand the world around us.

#### Innovation

Squirrels class have started an innovation of their own this week: children are continuing a part of the story from our focus text Stig of the Dump by Clive King. With a focus on setting and character description, and the powerful language that can be used to evoke a response from the reader. The children have risen to the challenge of incorporating preposition phrases and punctuating dialogue with inverted commas magnificently.

#### Oaks

#### Academic

This week, we have started our new book in English; Survivors by David Long. We have already read three of the stories inside it and we are enjoying it immensely. We have spent this first week digging into the text; reading and analysing the language and impact it has, and comparing the short stories with the real accounts on which the stories are based.

#### Community

This week, we have been watching our sunflowers flourish in our classroom; we are planning on planting these so that everyone can see them as they are already fantastic!

#### Character Education

This week, we have been focused on 'critical thinking'. We have been exploring what this looks like and in doing so, we have realised that we think critically each and every day; making decisions and thinking about the best route to take.

#### Innovation

We have been starting our innovation process this week for two separate pieces of work: the first being a non-chronological report which the children are putting together to portray their knowledge of the First and Second World War. Secondly, we have started innovating our own pieces of art. This half term, we have been learning about abstract art and have started creating our own piece of abstract art based on the art of Pablo Picaso.


Please let me know if you are interested as this would be helpful for those running the choir to gauge numbers.


