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Dear Parents/Carers,

It gives me great pleasure to be able to extend to you a warm welcome back to school for the new academic year. It has been a genuine pleasure to see children returning to both our schools so positively, and dressed so smartly, with such a spring in their step. I would like to extend an especially warm welcome to our new families with children who have just begun their educational journey with us in reception. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your generosity with the gifts for school staff at the end of last year – they are truly appreciated...thank you.

At Burlescombe school, I am delighted to confirm that swimming starts next week on Wednesday 13th September and will commence for a total of 12 sessions finishing on Wednesday 6th September. Whilst swimming in KS1 is not mandatory, we believe that it is an important life skill and with both schools situated close to a canal, I am very pleased that we can extend this important enrichment activity to children. Thank you to the Burlescombe PTFA, who have kindly offered to pay for the cost of the coach to transport children to and from Tiverton swimming pool; without their support, the cost per session would be considerably more expensive. Swimming at Webber's school will commence in the spring term for half the school and continue in the summer term for the other half.

This is a good opportunity for me to remind you of the excellent, and much needed, valuable work of the PTFAs at both schools. The money they donate to the school (funded by your engagement with their events throughout the year) enriches the education of children at both our schools, and in the current educational funding environment, it is much needed. If you would like to join either schools' PTFA, and contribute to shaping and organising the event they hold throughout the year, I know that you would receive a very warm welcome. Premier Sport-led clubs begin next week, with details being sent out today. If you would like your child to take part in one of these excellent sporting enrichment opportunities, do sign up as soon as possible, as there are limited spaces, and they fill up quickly. Teacher-led clubs will begin the week after; again, details will be sent out today. Teachers choose to run these clubs to enrich All children in EYFS and KS1 are entitled to a free government-sponsored school lunch, which is delicious. If you are a family in receipt of a low income, please do email either school office for help with how to apply for free school meals (FSM) at any age in primary school – each school receives additional funding for families in receipt of a low income, so this is an important step you can take for us, as well as being of benefit to your family.

Regarding food, I would like to make you aware that we have children with severe **NUT ALLERGIES** across both schools and therefore request that you do not send in nuts for ANY meals or snacks, to help keep these children safe. If your child has ANY **allergies** or **medical requirements**, please notify the school office as a matter of urgency.

Uffculme School Open Evening is being held this year on Thursday 28th September from 6pm-8pm, so if you're child is in year 6, and is likely to transfer to Uffculme school, do consider attending.

I am pleased to confirm that we have appointed a new **Social Inclusion Officer** to replace Jen Marshall, who started the role last year. Her name is Hannah Gleeson, and more information about her, and her role, will be included in the next newsletter. This represents Alumnis' continued commitment to the support of teachers, children and families in our communities, and we are very lucky to be in receipt of her services.

I am very pleased to announce that both schools now have representation on social media. Webber's and Burlescombe now have Facebook pages, on which you will find (in time) pictures of children engaged in their learning, comments from staff and photos of developments in school. Please do check them out and help us spread the word of all the good work going on in our schools.

I have some exciting news to share about Burlescombe school. Staff have been working very hard over the summer holiday to create our new, discrete **library**. This is an area which will be used to work with small groups of children and also gives children a relaxing, comfortable space to choose and read books. Have a look on Burlescombe's new Facebook page to see what it looks like. I would like to children's experience at school, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank them for willingly giving their time to do so. Could I please ask all parents to check that you are signed up to the School Comms app, as this is the primary form of communication that both schools use. You can also pre-order school lunches for your child, make payments and give consent for enrichment activities quickly and easily. Your child is able to order their school lunch at the beginning of each day in either school, but you can use the app to pre-order if you prefer.

Curriculum Information Letters will be released next week, which detail the exciting learning that will be taking place in each class this term. **Parent Meetings** will also be taking place over the next 2 weeks – these are a chance for you to meet your child's class teacher, find out about school routines, and ask any questions you might have. These will be scheduled on a Tuesday or a Thursday at 3pm, so please do attend if you are able.

CHILDREN'S CORNER

<u>Class 1</u>

Class 1 children have had a brilliant start to the new year. The New Reception children have come in with smiles on their faces and have enjoyed exploring their new learning environment and started to develop new friendships. We have all been taking advantage of outdoor play in the sunshine. The children have followed obstacle courses, built a train and houses, searched for minibeasts and have created lots of appetising mud dishes which will explain why some of the children have got a little muddy! We have also been discussing how we are all unique, have different families and like different things. The Year 1 children blew me away with their wonderful writing today. Well done Class 1.

Class 2

2 have enjoyed exploring their new classroom this week and have been very excited to be back with their friends. We have planned and written some very exciting fictional stories set in the summer holidays. Everyone showed great courage when reading their ideas aloud to the class and we were definitely left in suspense by many of our young authors! We have also enjoyed a week of inspirational maths activities which have included making our own tessellating patterns, learning some fun dice games and exploring problem solving in creative ways using shapes.
